DevOps is one of the hottest trends in engineering/IT process evolution. Depending on whom you listen to DevOps has the potential to solve all the problems of product innovation, time to market, quality and cost all at once. Marc will present his own views of real world DevOps, pitfalls and suggested approaches.

Marc Hornbeek is Sr. Solutions Architect at Spirent Communications. He recently managed DevOps Infrastructure for Spirent's Cloud and IP business unit. He has performed as the primary architect of test and lab automation tools and champion of test automation for firms ranging from start-ups to large multi-national companies. He has published more than 30 articles and has been a speaker at numerous conferences and user forums primarily regarding topics related to continuous automated testing, DevOps and network lab automation.



Marc was a key contributor to the original ISO 9646 TTCN protocol test notation standard, a founder of the ISDN User Forum and was a CCITT Rapporteur for protocol conformance testing standards. He was the primary founder for the first company that innovated network lab automation. He is a senior member of IEEE and has held officer positions for the Ventura California Chapter. He has won multiple company innovation awards for test automation and protocol test systems that are considered strategic to the success of the businesses that use them.

Take the Ventura Freeway 101 South.
Take Lynn Road Exit, turn left, drive 2.9 miles.
Lynn Road turns into Olsen Road, drive .9 miles.

Turn Right onto Faculty Street
Park on Faculty Street or adjacent streets.

Directions from Los Angeles:

Take the Ventura Freeway 101 North.
Take Lynn Road Exit, turn right, drive 2.9 miles.
Lynn Road turns into Olsen Road, drive .9 miles.
Turn right onto Mountclef Boulevard - the University is on the right.
Turn Right onto Faculty Street
Park on Faculty Street or adjacent streets.
Parking on the street is open after 7 pm.
Prior to 7 pm, Respect parking signs and do not park in faculty spots.
Visitors may park on the streets after 7 pm without a permit.
Important: do not park in the spots marked "Homeowner Parking only".
Before 7 pm, we recommend to park in the G lot on the southwest corner of Olsen and MountClef and walk to the Swenson building.
